Engineers Give Lake Ralph Hall Preliminary Okay *Initial field work confirms feasibility of proposed lake*

Ladonia, TX – Engineers at Chiang Patel & Yerby today announced that after months of preliminary field work, they have found no “fatal flaws” in the Lake Ralph Hall project. “No fatal flaws” is engineer-speak for geotechnical, environmental and cultural resources, finding no significant concerns that could prohibit the lake from being built. Upper Trinity officials indicate that they will continue their planning efforts.

“Site engineers have made very positive progress reports; all evidence confirms Lake Ralph Hall can generate a safe, dependable source of water for the families and communities who depend on Upper Trinity,” said Thomas E. Taylor, Executive Director for Upper Trinity Regional Water District. He added, “And the Lake will provide economic and environmental benefits for the people of Fannin County.”
